



Flying International?

The Terminal 1 International Non-Passenger Screening Point (NPS) will be closed on Monday March 25th, 2019 from 2200-0600hrs (26th) and Tuesday March 26th, 2019 from 2200-0600hrs (27th).

During the closure, employees will be able to access the international sector via lane 7 (usually the family/assistance lane) at the Terminal 1 International Pre-Board Screening Point (PBS).

Lane 7 will be operating with full screening PBS rules which means all liquids, creams, gels and pastes must be under 100ml

Temporary pass issuance will still take place from the current location at the International NPS desk.

Meetings with the Company & 737

Just a reminder that due to the grounding of the 737 all CAMs, absenteeism and investigatory meetings have been cancelled by the Company for March 2019. Most managers will be out on the floor supporting the operation in an attempt to assist passengers and ensure further aircraft are not grounded and/or delayed. Air Canada has announced that the 737's will be grounded until at least July 2019.

No Cuts to Education

On March 15, 2019, The Ford Government laid out a plan to cut millions of dollars from public education. They will do this by increasing class sizes from Grades 4 - 12, removing special education funding, and requiring all high school students to take four online courses.

Privatization and contracting out of public education would move us closer to a U.S.—style system that has sent billions in public funds into the pockets of private corporations.

CUPE says the Liberal government's final budget before the October 2019 election fails to give Canadians help when they need it most.
